

## **Nnaoke Ufere, Ph.D.**

Dr. Nnaoke Ufere serves as the CEO and Chairman of the board of directors of iServiceX, Inc., an international management and technology consultancy, headquartered in Atlanta, Georgia. His professional career spans over 30 years in engineering, management, consulting, finance and entrepreneurial ventures. Prior to founding iServiceX, he was a Vice President/Partner at A. T. Kearney, Inc. and Gemini Consulting, Inc. where he led business development, client relationship management and engagement delivery practice groups. He worked on engagement issues of strategy and innovation, mergers & acquisitions, operations & supply chain management and information technology strategy for Fortune 500 clients in the energy, consumer products, biotechnology, telecommunications and financial institutions. He served as a senior field operations engineer at Schlumberger Wireline Services in several countries.

In addition to his work in the private sector, Dr. Ufere has consulted for governments in Sub-Saharan African countries on national economic strategy to mitigate the deleterious effects of corruption on economic performance and human development. He has consulted for the United Nations and authored a field guide for member states to identify and manage corruption risks in the extractive industries.

Dr. Ufere currently serves on the boards of directors of Unconscious Cognition, Inc., and Oildata Ltd. Dr. Ufere also serves on the board of trustees at Kennesaw State University. He is the chairman of the board at Global Institute for Ethics and Moral Development — an anti-corruption policy collaborative.

Dr. Ufere earned a Ph.D. in Management (Designing Sustainable Systems) from the Weatherhead School of Management at Case Western Reserve University. He holds an MBA from Harvard Business School and B.Eng. (First Class, Honors) in Electrical/Electronics Engineering from the University of Nigeria, Nsukka, where he received the University award for academic excellence for having the best academic record in his graduating class.
